Daily clues will be posted at 8:00 AM starting Monday, July 29 until Saturday, August 3, 2013 unless the medallion is found.

CONTEST DETAILS AND RULES

1. The Canadian Days Medallion will be found on Little Canada public land.
2. No digging will be necessary. The use of shovels or other digging tools are NOT permitted.
3. No climbing will be necessary.
4. No disassembly will be required to find the medallion including irrigation heads, light fixtures and other equipment.
5. Searchers must not damage public property or otherwise violate laws or ordinances. For example, city parks open daily at ½ hour before sunrise and close ½ hour after sunset.
6. City of Little Canada employees, Canadian Days Committee members, US Bank employees, (or family members of said employees or members), are NOT eligible to win. Family members are defined as parents, children or siblings.
7. If the medallion is found between the hours of 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM (Monday – Friday), please call the Little Canada City Offices at 651-766-4029 to report your discovery. If there is an after hours finding, please call 651-492-4680 and leave a message with your name and phone number. Whoever finds the medallion must report the discovery immediately.
8. Medallion searchers must purchase a **\$3 Canadian Days button** as a button is required to claim the prize. ***Proceeds from the button sales help to support the cost of the all-volunteer community festival.***
9. Searchers assume all risk for personal injury.
10. Taxes due are the responsibility of the winner.
11. The winner will be required to recite the clue that led him/her to the medallion and may be asked to sign a photo release form for publicity and promotional purposes.
12. If the medallion is not found by 9:00 PM August 3, the hunt will terminate and the money will carry forward to next year.
13. The decisions of the Canadian Days Committee are final.
